Seminar 1: Do We Need New Forms and Sources of Financing for Education?

If the international goals for education, existing and proposed, are to be met, financing gaps need to be filled. Given the persistent problems of out of school children and of poor learning by children in school, there is increasing interest in having more results-based financing in education. Meanwhile, many new sources of funding for education have become available in recent years in addition to that by parents, governments and aid donors: particularly notable are non-DAC donors, philanthropic foundations and private investors. Innovative financing has also helped other sectors, especially health, to make important advances, but has not yet really taken off in education. The seminar will explore these trends and examine the scope for new sources and new forms of financing for education in developing countries.
