The Surprising Lack of Evidence about What Works in Education – Implications for Policymakers

Education policymakers in developing countries have been slower than those in other sectors to base policy on evidence. This is now beginning to change, and there is also growing interest in educational innovation. After first showing how it is learning (not just enrollment) that contributes to economic development, this lecture will explore what is and is not known about what works in education at the school level and also examine the role of innovations. It will discuss what policymakers can do in the absence of evidence and also how they themselves can help generate evidence and stimulate innovation.
