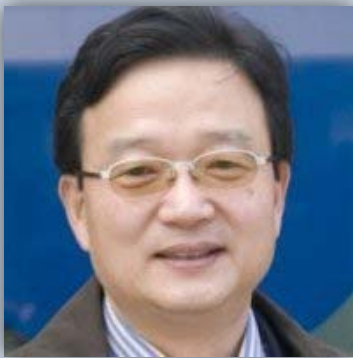


**A BEAR story: Better Education for Africa's Rising
