## “Britain and the Bomb” by Keynote Speaker, Dr. William James Nuttall

Following a First Class degree in Physics from the University of East Anglia in 1987, Dr. William Nuttall won a Fulbright Post-Graduate Student Award to the Massachusetts Institute of Technology to study for a PhD in physics. On returning to the UK in 1993, he worked as a scientist at Keele and Birmingham universities and then for the Institute of Physics in science policy. He joined the teaching faculty of Cambridge University in 2002. He moved to the Open University in 2012. Professor Nuttall has published several books including the monograph Nuclear Renaissance Technologies and Policies for the Future of Nuclear Power (Taylor and Francis, 2005) and he will soon publish another monograph Britain and the Bomb: Technology, Culture, and the Cold War (Whittles Publishing UK). He is a Fellow of Hughes Hall, University of Cambridge, UK.
