Instructions for Preparation and Submission of Papers

- 1. Full paper submission is required for oral presentations. If you only desire a poster presentation, you do not need to submit a full paper. You can submit a short paper, or only an abstract paper with the downloaded template. You can select "poster presentation" in the online submission site
 - (http://www.lhweb.jp/knt/comhi2009/apami_form/submission.html).
- 2. Some of the rejected papers for oral presentation, we may ask to move to poster presentation and to shorten the paper.

- 3. Submitted papers should be in English and structured under the following headings: Title of Paper, Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion and Conclusion (but not limits to).
- 4. Full papers should be typed and accompanied by an Abstract not exceeding 500 words. The paper itself should not exceed 8 A4 pages (by using template), including tables, graphs and references.
- 5. The affiliated institutes of all authors should be stated.
- 6. Bibliographical references should be written in American National Standards Institute (ANSI) standard style (http://www.nlm.nih.gov/bsd/uniform_requirements.html).
- 7. The detail paper format can be downloaded this site.
- 8. All paper must be uploaded by the online submission site. Do not send the paper by e-mail.
- 9. Paper should be uploaded as a PDF format. Name of the PDF file should be "Last name initial of first name Country) as (Kimura-M-Japan). If you want to submit two papers, add number 2 right after the initial of first name as (Kimura-M2-Japan).
- 10. Papers must not have been previously published.
- 11. Papers will be peer-reviewed by the APAMI2009 SPC members.
- 12. Authors are responsible for the accuracy of their papers and will be required to sign a Publication Confirmation and Authorization form. This should be returned to the Conference Secretariat by fax with the final version of the paper (after acceptance notification).

Young author award

The award is open to young authors (under 35 years of age), conducting research on medical informatics and who submit a research paper. The paper will be selected by the APAMI2009 SPC members during the conference.
