One-minute Speech

Each student is expected to make a short speech (one-minute) one or twice in the class (depending on the registered number of students). Students can choose one or two topics from the essay assignments. You can also select topics from followings: my hobby, what I like about Japan, my future dream, new cultural experiences in Japan, Japanese term and concept that interest me, what I miss about my country. The date for the speech is listed in the course schedule.

Vocabulary Quiz

Vocabulary Quiz is to be held. Please refer to the schedule on Page2. The basic rule is **there is no make-up for the missed quiz** unless you have a special reason and contact the teaching staff prior to the class. In vocabulary quiz, in some questions your knowledge about the grammar in the designated lessons is required in answering the questions.

Assignments

Some assignments will be handed out in the class. Here are the rules regarding the assignments. As a rule, late assignment will not be accepted from the perspective of fairness in assessing it.

- (1) Assignment via Moodle: required to be submitted via moodle by the deadline.
- (2) Paper format assignment: required to be submitted at the beginning of the class, and students are not allowed to work on the assignment during the class. If a student works

- If you come to the class without studying the lesson, it will make you frustrated, and furthermore, it will take double the amount of time to review it later and digest the material.
- Please take the class as a place where you review the lesson, make sure your correct understanding of the material, and use it in actual interactions so that you can effectively use what you are learning in actual settings.
