Brief Introduction about Japan and Hiroshima



Japan is a four seasons country which has 47 prefectures that divided by 8 regions with Tokyo as the capital city.

Hokkaido is the northern and Okinawa is the southern. The four largest archipelagos of Japan are; Hokkaido, Honshu, Shikoku and Kyushu. Each prefecture had its characteristics and varies of different specialty. The four seasons period are divided into; Winter from December-February, spring from March-May, summer from June-August, and autumn from September-November.



The atomic bomb dome (genbaku dome/A-bomb dome) is a part of the Hiroshima Peace Memorial Park and being one of UNESCO world heritage site on 1996. The ruin of the hall serves as a memorial to the people who were killed in the atomic bombing on 6 August 1945.

Established 1949, and have three campus which is located in Higashi-hiroshima, Kasumi, and Higashi-senda. Here you will spend your one/half year study abroad in Higashi-hiroshima campus. Have fun and enjoy your study abroad!



Hiroshima is the largest city in Chugoku region, and famous for its *okonomiyaki* (Hiroshima style) and *Momiji manju*.



Itsukushima is an island in the western part of the Inland Sea of Japan, located on the northwest of Hiroshima Bay. It is popularly known as Miyajima, which in Japanese means 'Shrine Island'. You can also see beautiful scenery of momiji on autumn and a lot of cherry blossoms on spring in this island.

A copy of your passport, certificate of residence, or residence card, may be required to contract with a telephone/internet company.






Daiso (Inside Youme Town)

Shoji


A supermarket where you can find daily necessities but you cannot find additional stuffs (kitchen equipment etc.). But, there's a drug store beside the supermarket.



HU Password Registration and E-mail

You can register your password and e-mail at the Information Media Center, or at the West Office (2nd floor of the West Library) or the North Office of the Information Media Center (1st floor of

the Central Library). Your account name is your student number first letter in lowercase, followed by 6 numbers; ex: c150066), and it will be available for use immediately after registration. Your account also could use for connecting to Wi-Fi and another HU account for example account on Bb9. Once you have created your account and password, the password is applied as same to all your HU account.

Password Policy

Must be 8 characters of more (max. of 20)

Password must be at least 8 alphanumeric characters long and must contain at least 3 of

the following:

Uppercase letter: between A until Z Lowercase letter: between a until z

Numbers: 0 until 9

Symbols: "#\$ % & '+, -./:; <=>? @ [] ^ `|~!

After registering your password, your email address will be (student number)@hiroshima-u.ac.jp. while you are student at HU, all messages will be sent to this address.
